CHAPTER LI.

March 6, 1871.

An Act to legalize the record of certain certificates executed under and by virtue of Section eleven, Chapter eighty-one, Title one, Statutes of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. Failure to acknowledge and accord certain certificates within stipulated time not to invalidate same.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Failure to record not to invalidate.

Section 1. That no certificate executed under and by virtue of section eleven, chapter eighty-one, title one, statutes of Minnesota, shall be deemed invalid by reason of the same not having been executed, proved, acknowledged and recorded within the twenty days mentioned in said section, and the record of all such certificates heretoforeexecuted, proved, acknowledged and recorded after the expiration of said twenty days, is hereby legalized and made valid, and said record shall have the same force and effect as it said certificate had been executed, proved, acknowledged and recorded within the said twenty days.
