

CHAPTER LXIV.

An Act to amend Chapter seventeen of the general laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy, relating to the service of process in certain cases. March 6, 1871.

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section one (1), Chapter seventeen (17), General Laws of 1870.

Upon whom papers in civil actions may be served against railroad companies.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one of chapter seventeen of the general laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy, be so amended as to read as follows:

Section 1. The service of all process and papers in any civil action or proceeding before any justice of the peace, or in the district court against any railroad company within this state, may be made upon any acting ticket or freight agent of such company, within the county in which the action or proceeding shall be commenced, and shall be taken and held in all cases to be a legal service. *Provided*, That whenever any railroad company has appeared in an action by an attorney, thereafter such service shall be made upon the attorney of record.

In actions against railroad companies on whom papers to be served.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

When act to take effect.
