

CHAPTER XXIV.

March 2, 1871. *An Act to amend an act entitled an act to incorporate the Village of East Janesville, approved February twenty-eight, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.*

SECTION 1. Amendment to Section one (1), Chapter nine (9), Special Laws of 1870. Boundary lines of said village—incorporate rights.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Boundary lines—

SECTION 1. All of section twenty-six except the north half of the northeast quarter thereof, and the south half of section twenty-seven, southeast quarter of section twenty-eight, east half of section thirty-three, all of sections thirty-four and thirty-five, in township one hundred and eight north, of range twenty-four, and the northeast quarter of section four, all of section three and the north half of section two, in township one hundred and seven north, of twenty-four west, in Waseca county, in the state of Minnesota, shall be known as the village of East Janesville, and by that name may sue and be sued, make contracts, purchase, take and hold real and personal property, and have a corporate seal, alterable at pleasure. Every grant and devise of lands, or right or transfer of property which has been or may be made for the benefit of its inhabitants, shall have the same effect as if made to the village by name.

SEC. 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage.
