

CHAPTER LXXV.

An Act to amend Chapter Seventy-One of the General Laws of 1867, concerning offences against Property.

March 1, 1872.

SECTION 1. Amendment to section 1 of chapter 71 of general statutes of 1867, relating to punishment for offences against property.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one (1) of chapter seventy-one (71) of the general laws of Minnesota for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven (1867) be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 15. Whoever commits the crime of larceny by stealing of the property of another any money, goods or chattels, or both [bank] note, bond, promissory note, bill of exchange, or other bill, order or certificate, or any book of accounts, for or concerning money or goods due or to become due, or to be delivered, or any deed or writing containing a conveyance of land, or any other valuable contract in force, or any receipt, or release, or defeasance, or any writ, process or public record; if the value of the property stolen is one hundred (100) dollars or over, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison not more than seven (7) years nor less than one (1) year; if the value of the property stolen is less than one hundred (100) dollars, and more than twenty (20) dollars, he shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison not more than three (3) years nor less than six (6) months, or by imprisonment in the county jail not more than six months nor less than three months, or by fine not exceeding three hundred (300) dollars; and if the value of the property stolen does not exceed twenty (20) dollars he shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not more than three (3) months or by fine not exceeding one hundred (100) dollars.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
