## CHAPTER XCIII.

An Act to Repeal Chapter Seventy-Nine (79) of the General Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Seventy, (1870.)

February 10, 1872.

Section 1. Repeal of chapter 79 of the general laws of 1870.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That chapter seventy-nine (79) of the gen-Repeal of law: eral laws of eighteen hundred and seventy (1870) be and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1st, 1872.

## CHAPTER XCIV.

An Act to amend Section Two (2) of Chapter Twenty (20) of the General Laws of 1871.

February 27, 1872.

RECTION 1. Change of senatorial and representative boundaries in the thirty sixth district.

2. When act to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That that part of section two which provides for the thirty-sixth senatorial district be amended so as to read as follows:

Thirty-sixth district changed. The thirty-sixth district shall be composed of the counties of Sibley and McLeod, and shall be entitled to elect one senator; and the towns of Sibley, Kelso, Henderson, Dryden, Arlington, Jessenland, Washington Lake and Faxon, in the county of Sibley, shall be entitled to elect one representative; and the towns of New Auburn and Green Isle, in the county of Sibley and the towns of Glencoe, Helen, Bergen, Rich Valley, Hale and Winsted, in the county of McLeod, shall be entitled to elect one representative, and all the balance of the counties of McLeod and Sibley lying west of the line between range twenty-eight and twentynine, shall be entitled to elect one representative.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after its passage.

## CHAPTER XCV.

February 27, 1872.

An Act authorizing the Adjutant General to complete the Revision and Correction of the War Record of Minnesota Soldiers, and Appropriating Money for said Purpose.

SECTION 1. Completion of revision of war record of Minnesota soldiers authorized.

2. Appropriation to the adjutant general therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Appropriation for completion of war record. Section 1. That the adjutant general is hereby authorized and empowered to continue, and complete the revision and correction of the war record of Minnesota soldiers, in accordance with the provisions of section one, of chapter twelve, of the general laws of 1871.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose set forth in section one of
