<i>Bonds</i> , special, of state, to be issued to each company as a loan of credit. \$1,250,000 each. Aggregate \$5,000,000. To bear interest at seven per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually in New York city. How issued. Evidence that any ten miles have been completed ready for superstructure, satisfactory to governor to entitle road to receive \$100,000 in bonds. Same for every ten miles. Every ten miles
