

## CHAPTER XXXVI.

## AN ACT TO EXTEND THE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ST. PAUL.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION. 1. That the corporate limits of the city of St. Paul be and the same is hereby extended as follows, to wit: To include the north west quarter of section twenty-eight, town twenty-nine north, of range twenty-two west; also to include the north half of section twenty nine, town twenty-nine north, of range twenty-two west; also to include the north half of section thirty, town twenty-nine north, of range twenty-two; also to include the north half of section twenty-five, town twenty-nine north, of range twenty-three, west; also to include the north half of section twenty-six, town twenty-nine north, of range twenty-three west; also to include all of section twenty-three and the east half of section twenty-two and the north east quarter of the north-east quarter of section twenty-seven, town twenty-nine, range twenty-three.

SEC. 2. The territory hereby added to the said corporation of the city of St. Paul, shall hereafter be subject to the jurisdiction, laws and ordinances, now or hereafter in force in said city, and all persons residing or being thereon, except as hereinafter specially provided.

SEC. 3. It is hereby expressly declared that neither the territory hereby added to said city, nor the lands, tenements or hereditaments, nor the personal property of any resident, situate and being, or which may be situate on said territory hereby added to said city, shall ever be assessed or taxed for the payment of any part, either principal or interest, of the existing debt of said city, either funded or otherwise; but all assessments or levies of taxes for such antecedent indebtedness of said city aforesaid is hereby expressly prohibited. And the common council of said city of St. Paul is hereby authorized to apportion the territory hereby added to said city, to such of the wards of said city as they may deem most expedient and convenient for the inhabitants thereof.

SEC. 4. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
