the public expense, free of charge to his or her relatives or friends, and upon equal terms with every other insane

person.

All distinction between "public" and "pri-Distinction vate" patients, as defined in any law or statute of this between public and private pastate, is hereby abolished; and all resident insane persons within the state shall be deemed and treated as "public patients," and all laws, acts or parts of acts in relation to "private patients," or contrary to the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from When act to take and after its passage.

## CHAPTER XX.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER TEN OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE, RELAT-ING TO AN ASYLUM FOR INEBRIATES.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That chapter ten of the general laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-three, relating to an inebriate asylum, be amended by adding thereto, after section five, the two following sections, viz.:

No person applying for a license under the when Boense provisions of this act, who shall have evaded payment of any license for which he was liable for any former year, shall be entitled to receive such license without first paying all licenses so evaded and for which he was liable.

SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of every county auditor Duty of county in this state to make complaint before some justice of the peace of each and every person in his county violating any of the provisions of this act, and the county attorney of each county shall prosecute all offenders to final judgment.
