

SEC. 4. Said bonds shall be filed and retained in the office of the secretary of state, and for any failure to comply with any of the conditions therein contained may be prosecuted in the name of the state in any court of competent jurisdiction, and the amount of damages when collected shall be paid into the state treasury.

Bonds to be filed in office of Secretary of State.

SEC. 5. The secretary of state shall certify to the state auditor from time to time the amount due to such contractors, for stationery and paper when [then] furnished under said contract, who shall issue his warrant upon the state treasury for the amount so certified, to be paid out of moneys appropriated for that purpose. *Provided*, That said auditor shall not give his warrant for an amount to exceed seventy-five per cent. of the amount certified until said contract shall be fully completed and fulfilled.

Secretary of State to furnish account to State Auditor.

SEC. 6. The printing paper of the state shall be kept and issued by the secretary of state, and used and accounted for by the contractor for the public printing as provided in the laws relating to the public printing. The writing paper and other stationer's supplies shall be securely kept by the secretary of state, and issued by him for use in any state department or office, upon the requisition and receipt of the chief officer therein, and for use in either branch of the legislature, upon the requisition and receipt of the secretary or chief clerk thereof.

Custodian of printing paper.

SEC. 7. The secretary of state shall annually report to the legislature of the state at its first meeting in each year the exact amount of all stationery, printing paper, etc., contracted for and purchased by him, and the prices paid for the same.

To report to legislature.

SEC. 8. Chapter fifteen of the general laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-six entitled an act to provide for the purchase of paper for the public printing is hereby repealed.

Repeal of former act.

CHAPTER IX.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE STATE TREASURER TO MAKE TEMPORARY USE OF THE SINKING OR OTHER FUNDS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Use of sinking
fund authorized.

SECTION 1. That the state treasurer is authorized to borrow and use temporarily from the sinking or other funds, other than any school funds, eighty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary to supply any deficiency that may exist in the revenue fund; *Provided*, That it will not impair said respective funds so that they cannot meet all demands, as the exigencies may require.

When to take
effect.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER X.

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE TREASURER TO PAY OVER CERTAIN MONEYS IN HIS HANDS TO SIBLEY COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Disposition of
school funds of
said county.

SECTION 1. That the state treasurer be and he is hereby directed and required to pay over, upon demand, to the treasurer of Sibley county all school money in his hands apportioned to said county for the use of common schools therein.

When act to take
effect.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XI.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 28 OF TITLE 4, OF CHAPTER SIX (6), OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF MINNESOTA, RELATING TO THE DUTIES OF THE STATE TREASURER AND THE CARE OF THE PUBLIC FUNDS.
