JOINT RESOLUTION FOR THE RELIEF OF DESTITUTE EMIGRANTS.

WHEREAS, Most of the emigrants coming to Minnesota have been attracted by the emigration documents published and annually distributed by the state; and

WHEREAS, Among this large number of emigrants many cases of destitution occur, from various sources, such as loss of baggage, loss of money by sharpers on railroad trains, over charges by transportation companies, sickness, or even death while in transit; and

WHEREAS, Emigrants thus afflicted expect aid and assistance from the state authorities; and

WHEREAS, Common humanity requires that the state makes provision for such cases of misfortune; therefore

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appropriated and placed at the disposal of the governor, to be used by him for the relief of such cases of destitution and suffering among emigrants, which, in his opinion require the intervention and protection of the state.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
