into effect for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-four, and the further sum of one thousand dollars annually for two years thereafter, which shall be paid by the state treasurer from time to time on the warrant of the state auditor, out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated. *Provided*, That no greater expenditure shall be made nor liability incurred against the state in any one year than the amount appropriated for such year.

When act to

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

### CHAPTER CLIII.

AN ACT TO SECURE FOR THE STATE A PROPER REPRESENTATION OF ITS RESOURCES, PRODUCTS AND MANUFACTURIES, AT THE INTERNATIONAL EXPOSITION AT PHILADELPHIA, IN EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. The sum of five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the state treasury, for the purpose of enabling the state board of centennial managers, heretofore appointed, consisting of Pennock Pusey, Phillip S. Harris and Paris Gibson, to make a proper display of the mineral, agricultural and natural resources of our state, and of its manufactories and products, at the international exposition at Philadelphia, in eighteen hundred and seventy-six.

Disposition of  
funds, how.

SEC. 2. Said money shall be expended on the order of said commissioners, in such way as they shall deem will best accomplish the object expressed in the first section, and best conduce to the advantage, reputation and interests of the state in said exposition; *Provided*, That no part of said amount shall be used as pay for services rendered by said board.

When to make  
report.

SEC. 3. Said board shall report to the governor prior to the next session of the legislature, their action, and a statement of the means used by them to accomplish the objects of their appointment.

When act to  
take effect.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
