

CHAPTER LXXIX.

AN ACT TO ABOLISH SOLITARY IMPRISONMENT IN THE
STATE PRISON.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That in all cases where the time of imprisonment is during life, solitary imprisonment in the state prison is hereby abolished, excepting for prison discipline.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. When act to take effect.

CHAPTER LXXX.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 1, OF THE LAWS OF 1868,
ENTITLED AN ACT TO REORGANIZE AND PROVIDE FOR THE
GOVERNMENT AND REGULATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF
MINNESOTA, &C.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That chapter 1, of the laws of 1868, entitled an act to reorganize and provide for the University of Minnesota, &c., be amended by adding thereto the following, sections:

Sec. 17. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or dispose of any spirituous, vinous or malt liquors within a distance of three-quarters of a mile of the University of Minnesota, as now located in the city of Minneapolis. Sale of liquor prohibited—violation.

Sec. 18. Any person violating the provisions of the foregoing section, shall upon conviction, be fined not less than fifty, nor more than one hundred dollars for every such offense, or shall be imprisoned in the county jail of the county of Hennepin for a period of not less than two nor more than twelve months.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. When act to take effect.
