be and the same hereby are set apart for incorporation and incorporated as a village under the corporate name and style of the "village of Marshall" to be organized pursuant to chapter one hundred and thirtynine (139) of the general laws of 1875. SEC. 2. That C. A. Edwards, J. I. Reichers, Charles H. Whitney,

SEC. 2. That C. A. Edwards, J. I. Reichers, Charles H. Whitney, C. F. Case, Orin Drake, John Ward and John A. Coleman of said town of Lake Marshall, be and the same are hereby designated to give notice of and for a meeting of the legal voters of said territory to organize said village, and elect officers pursuant to said chapter.

SEC. 3. The territory constituting said village when organized shall be known and designated as road district number one of said town of Lake Marshall.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XIV.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF LEROY.

'Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. All that part of the county of Mower, in the state of Minnesota, known and described as the northwest quarter. and a strip thirty (30) rods in width from the north part of the north half of the southwest quarter of section thirty-four (34), and all that part of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section thirty-three (33); lying and being north of the main track of the Milwaukee & Saint Paul Railroad, all in township one hundred and one (101), north of range fourteen west, is hereby set apart and incorporated as the village of Leroy, under the provisions of chapter one hundred and thirtynine of the general laws of 1875, entitled, an act to provide for the incorporation of villages, and the amendments thereto.

SEC. 2. D. S. Fifield, W. L. Henderson and C. A. Roy, are hereby designated as the persons to carry out the provisions of section nine of the said chapter, and the secretary of state is hereby directed to issue his official notification of the passage of this act to said persons.

SEC. 3. In addition to the general powers conferred by the said chapter, the village council of said village shall also have power.

First.—To prescribe such additional duties for the officers of said village as they may by ordinance direct.

Second,—To provide for the publication in a newspaper of notices and ordinances.

Third.—To appoint such additional special officers for said village as may be necessary therefor.

SPECIAL LAWS

Fourth.—To prescribe the limits within which wooden buildings or buildings not fire proof shall not be erected, placed or repaired.

Fifth.—To prevent the obstruction of streets or public grounds by railway cars or otherwise.

SEC. 4. This act is a public act and need not be pleaded nor proven in any court in this state.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER XV.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF REDWOOD FALLS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That all that part of Redwood county, in the state of Minnesota, embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit : The west half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of section six (6), in township one hundred and twelve (112), range thirty-five, all of section one (1), and the east half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of section two (2), in township one hundred and twelve (112), range thirty-six (36), all of section thirty-one (31), in township one hundred and thirteen (113), range thirty-five (35), and all of section thirty-six (36), in township one hundred and thirteen (113), range thirty-six (30), as the same is designated upon the plat of the United States government survey, shall be know as the village of Redwood Falls, and the inhabitants thereof shall be and form a municipal corporation, and shall have the powers possessed by a municipal corporation at common law, and in addition thereto, shall possess the powers specially granted under and by virtue of chapter 139 of the general laws of 1875, state of Minnesota.

SEC. 2. Birney Flynn, C. C. Stickle and S. J. F. Ruter, are hereby appointed a committee to call the first election for the organization of said village, as required by section 9, chapter 139, general laws of 1875.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
