

## CHAPTER CCII.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF STILLWATER APPROVED MARCH THIRD, ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY, RELATING TO LICENSES.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. That the subdivision designated as first of section two (2) of chapter four (4) of an act of the Legislature of the state Minnesota, entitled an act to reduce the law incorporating the city of Stillwater in the county of Washington and state of Minnesota, and the several acts amendatory thereof into one act and to amend the same "approved March third, eighteen hundred and seventy, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 2. (2) First.—To license and regulate the exhibition of common showmen, or shows of any kind, or the exhibition of caravans, circuses, concerts or theatrical performances, and to license and regulate billiard and pigeon hole tables and bowling saloons, and to provide for the abatement and removal of nuisances, under the ordinances or at common law or under this act, and to grant licenses for and to regulate groceries, taverns, victualing houses, and all persons vending or dealing in spirituous, vinous, malt, fermented, mixed or intoxicating liquors; *Provided*, That the license for so dealing in spirituous, vinous, malt, fermented, mixed or intoxicating liquors, shall be at least one hundred dollars a year, and as much higher as the council shall direct, and that no license shall be granted for a less term than one year, except as hereinafter provided; *Provided, however*, That the council may license, druggists to deal in such liquors to be used for medicinal or communion purposes only, and not to be drank on the premises, at not less than fifty dollars a year; *Provided, further*, That the council may at any time, upon the request of any person, duly licensed whose license has not yet expired, cancel said license and apply the unearned portion of the sum paid for said license in part payment of a license to deal in such liquors for the term of one year at the said place or room mentioned and described in the said license so cancelled.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
