

Sec. 4. And be it further provided that the village council of the said village of Fountain are hereby prohibited from granting any license for the vending, dealing in or disposing of spirituous, vinous, malt, or fermented liquors as provided for in section thirteen of chapter one hundred and thirty-nine of the general laws of 1875; whenever the legal voters of the township of Fountain (within which the said village of Fountain is located) shall vote "against license" as now provided for in chapter thirty-two of the general laws of 1870, and it is hereby made the duty of the village recorder of the said village of Fountain to procure from the town clerk's of said township of Fountain, such information as shall be necessary to inform the village council of the said village of Fountain of the action of said township in regard to such vote, which information shall be given by said recorder to said village council before any action in regard to granting license shall be taken.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER VII.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF WHALEN, FILLMORE COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That all that part of the township of Holt, Fillmore county, Minnesota, included within the following described limits and boundaries, and embracing the following described territory, to-wit: The northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of section sixteen (16), and the south half of the southwest quarter and the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section nine (9), and the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of section eight (8), all in township one hundred and three (103), range nine (9), shall be and hereby is created a village by the name of "The village of Whalen." And the people who now do or hereafter may reside within the said city are hereby created a corporation for municipal purposes, and as such vested with all the powers of municipal corporations at common law and under the statutes of this state.

SEC. 2. That G. H. Dyer, D. F. Jones and Joshua Downing, of said town, be and hereby are designated as the persons to give the notice required by the statute for the organization of said village.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
