CHAPTER 120.

AN ACT TO DETACH CERTAIN TERRITORY FROM FARIBAULT SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN RICE COUNTY, AND ANNEX THE SAME TO SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBER SEVENTY-SEVEN OF SAID COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That so much of the territory embraced within the limits of Faribault school district, in Rice county, as the same is created and defined in chapter fifteen (15) of the Special Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four (1864), as are embraced within the following description, to-wit: The south-west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the north-west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$), the north-west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the south-west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section twenty-five (25) of township one hundred and ten (110), north of range twenty-one (21) west, and containing, according to the government survey, one hundred (100) acres, be and the same is hereby detached from Faribault school district and annexed to school district number seventy-seven (77) of Rice county.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after

its passage.
