CHAPTER 146.

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT FISHING, EXCEPT BY HOOK AND LINE, IN BASS LAKE, IN THE TOWNSHIP OF DELAVAN, IN THE COUNTY OF FARIBAULT, MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. No person or persons shall hereafter catch, capture, or destroy, except with hook and line, any fish or fishes within the waters of Bass Lake, in the township of Delavan, Faribault

county, in the State of Minnesota.

SEC. 2. Whoever violates the provisions of the preceding section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of five dollars (\$5.00) for each and every offense, together with the costs of prosecution, and shall be committed to the county jail until such fine or fines and costs are paid. Justices of the peace shall have jurisdiction of all prosecutions under this act.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after

its passage.

CHAPTER 147.

AN ACT TO PREVENT THE CATCHING OF SALMON IN THE WATERS OF CERTAIN LAKES IN RICE COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to catch, kill or destroy, or carry away, any salmon from the waters of French Lake, Cedar Lake, Dudley Lake, Shields' Lake, Roberd's Lake, or any other lake in Rice county that has been or may be stocked with salmon under the direction of the State Fish Commissioners, for the term of two years, commencing with the date of approval of this act.
