CHAPTER 197.

AN ACT TO LEGALIZE THE VOTE CAST AT THE GENERAL ELECTION IN NOVEMBER, ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX (1876), IN THE TOWNS OF ACTON AND SWEDE GROVE, IN MEEKER COUNTY, MINNESOTA, UPON THE QUESTION OF ALLOWING CATTLE, HORSES, MULES AND ASSES TO RUN AT LARGE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the votes as cast, canvassed and returned in the towns of Acton and Swede Grove, in the county of Meeker, at the annual and general election held in November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six (1876), upon the question of allowing cattle, mules, horses and asses to run at large in said towns, are hereby declared to be as legal, effectual and binding as though proper notice had been given of such election, and as though the law under which such votes were cast and canvassed had been strictly followed and adhered to.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after

its passage.

CHAPTER 198.

AN ACT TO LEGALIZE. THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF HENNEPIN, MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That all meetings or sessions of the board of county commissioners of Hennepin county, Minnesota, heretore holden on the first (1st) Monday of any month, and all adjournments thereof, are hereby legalized and made regular sessions of said board; and all acts and proceedings of said board at said meetings are hereby made as legal and effective as if done and passed at a special session of said board duly called pursuant to law.
