Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 209.

AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN (117) OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX (1876), ENTITLED "AN ACT TO PREVENT A DIVERSION BY THE ST. PAUL AND PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, OF LANDS GRANTED BY CONGRESS TO THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, AND BY THE STATE TO SAID COMPANY, TO AID IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF A RAILROAD RUNNING FROM ST. CLOUD TO THE NAVIGABLE WATERS OF THE RED RIVER OF THE NORTH, BY SAID COMPANY, CONVERTING THAT PART OF SAID RAILROAD RUNNING NORTH FROM GLYNDON INTO A CONTINUATION OF THE MAIN LINE OF THE FIRST DIVISION OF THE ST. PAUL AND PACIFIC RAILROAD, AND ABANDONING THAT PART OF SAID RAILROAD RUNNING FROM MELROSE TO GLYNDON."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That chapter one hundred and seventeen (117) of the Special Laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six (1876), be and the same is hereby repealed.
