Fourth.—To prevent the obstruction of streets or public grounds by railway cars, or otherwise.

Fifth.—To provide compensation for the officers of the said

village.

SEC. 4. This act is a public act, and need not be pleaded nor

proven in any court of this State.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of July, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven (1877).

CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF DELAVAN, IN THE COUNTY OF FARIBAULT, UNDER THE GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE (1875).

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the following described territory in the county of Faribault, to-wit: Section thirty-six (36), town one hundred and four (104), range twenty-seven (27), be and the same is hereby incorporated as the village of Delavan.

SEC. 2. That Moses White, R. B. Johnson, and A. Anderson are hereby designated as commissioners to post notices of the first

(1st) election in said village.

SEC. 3. That upon organization, as directed in chapter one hundred and thirty-nine (139) of General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five (1875), the said territory shall constitute the village of Delavan, and shall thereafter be endowed with all the rights, powers, and duties therein prescribed.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after

its passage.
