

ther bonds with surety, or such further security to be filed or deposited with the clerk of such district court, for the payment of damages in consequence of such suspension or stay, which may be awarded against such appellant, in case he fail to obtain a reversal of the order or judgment so appealed from, as such district court may deem proper under the circumstances.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 18.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION NINETY-EIGHT (98), TITLE, THREE (3), CHAPTER EIGHT (8), GENERAL STATUTES ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SIX (1866) AS AMENDED BY SECTION ONE (1), CHAPTER TEN (10), GENERAL LAWS ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN (1877), RELATING TO COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Chapter 8 general statutes amended.

Chapter 10 general laws of 1877 amended.

Relating to jurors.

SECTION 1. That section ninety-eight (98), title three (3), chapter eight (8), General Statutes one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six (1866), as amended by section one (1), chapter ten (10), General Laws, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven (1877), be, and the same is hereby amended, by adding thereto the following additional proviso, *And provided further:* That in counties having two or more terms of court in one year, after the first term of said court, the clerk of the court shall retire from the original list, the names of all persons who have served at said term and notify the county commissioners thereof, and it shall be the duty of the county commissioners at their next session after said term, to select new names, equal in number to those retired, and the said clerk shall add the names so selected to the original list.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
