

## CHAPTER 29.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION ONE (1) OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND FOURTEEN (114), OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR (1874), BEING AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE SALARIES OF THE OFFICERS OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. That subdivision one (1) of section one (1) of Chapter one hundred and fourteen (114) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four (1874), is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

For salary of the Governor, three thousand eight hundred dollars (\$3,800.)

That subdivision three (3) of said section and Chapter is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

For salary of the State Auditor and Land Commissioner, three thousand dollars (\$3000.)

That subdivision five (5) of said section and Chapter is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

For salary of the Attorney General, two thousand dollars (\$2000.)

That subdivision ten (10) of said section and Chapter is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

For salary of the Librarian, fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.)

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 30.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER SEVEN (7) OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR (1874) RELATING TO THE NUMBER OF REPORTS OF THE STATE AUDITOR.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. That line four (4) of section twenty six (26) of Chapter seven (7) be, and the same is, hereby amended by striking out the words "twelve hundred and fifty," and inserting the words "two thousand," in lieu thereof.
