GENERAL LAWS

Relating to advertising expenses by railroad companies asking town aid. 102

One election only in one year.

Takes effect July 1st. be amended by adding to the end of said subdivision the following words: and said railroad company so desiring aid, shall pay the expenses of advertising such proposition in said newspapers; and *provided*, that no such election shall be called, except upon filing in the office of the town clerk a statement in writing in favor of calling said election, signed by the supervisors, town clerk and justices of the peace, or any two (2) of them together with at least twelve (12) other freeholders of said town.

SEC. 2. In the third (3rd) subdivision of section five (5) of said chapter the word and figure two (2) be struck out, and the word and figure one (1) be inserted.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July one (1), one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878).

CHAPTER 47.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION TWO (2), OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY (120), OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN (1877), RELATING.TO SALARY AND CLERK HIRE OF COUN-TY OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section two (2), of chapter one hundred and twenty (120), of the General Laws of the year A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven (1877), be and the same is hereby amended, by striking out the word "quarterly," in the second line of said section, and inserting in the place of the word so stricken out, the word "monthly."

SEO. 2. That this act shall take effect, and be in force from and after its passage.
