

CHAPTER 183.

AN ACT TO LEGALIZE CERTAIN BONDS ISSUED BY THE SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWN OF CHASKA IN THE COUNTY OF CARVER, KNOWN AS THE "COURT HOUSE BONDS."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the bonds of the town of Chaska in the county of Carver, issued by the supervisors of that town in pursuance of a resolution of the legal voters thereof, adopted at the special town meeting of said town held on the twelfth (12th) day of September A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and which said bonds were issued in payment, and in the place of the bonds of said town issued under and in pursuance of an act of the Legislature, entitled "an act to authorize the supervisors of the town of Chaska in the county of Carver, to issue the bonds of said town for court house purposes," approved March sixth (6th), one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one (1871), be and the same are hereby legalized and in all respects made valid.

SEC. 2. That the supervisors of said town of Chaska, be, and they are hereby authorized to cause taxes to be levied from year to year, upon the taxable property of said town for an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds as they mature, in addition to all other town taxes, and to apply all moneys arising from taxes heretofore levied to meet the principal and interest upon the bonds issued under the provisions of the act of the Legislature referred to in section one (1) of this act, to the payment of the bonds legalized and made valid by this act.

SEC. 3 This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 184.

AN ACT TO LEGALIZE THE ORGANIZATION OF THE TOWN OF LAKE BENTON.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the proceedings for the organization of the town of Lake Benton in Lincoln county, be and the same are hereby legalized as fully to all intents and purposes, as if all the legal steps had been properly taken.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
