

CHAPTER 263.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE DISPOSITION OF UNMARKED OR SO CALLED PRIZE LOGS CAUGHT BY THE SAINT CROIX BOOM COMPANY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. It is hereby made the duty of the Saint Croix Boom Company to deliver all unmarked or so called prize logs coming into their boom, the owners of which are unknown to the Lumberman's Board of Trade of the city of Stillwater, upon said board paying the lawful boomage for such logs.

SEC. 2. The Lumberman's Board of Trade of Stillwater shall make provisions for the sale and disposition of all logs so obtained, and use the proceeds arising therefrom in such manner and for such purposes as a majority of said board of trade may direct; *Provided*, That twenty-five (25) per centum of the net proceeds of such sales shall form a fund for the assistance, support and relief for disabled or maimed lumbermen and their families.

SEC. 3. The Lumberman's Board of Trade of Stillwater shall make rules and regulations fixing the amount of money or aid to be granted to disabled or maimed lumbermen and their families, and the times for which such aid shall be given.

SEC. 4. The said Lumberman's Board of Trade shall invest the funds so received and not necessary for immediate use, in such securities as they may deem best.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
