

CHAPTER 87.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS TEN AND ELEVEN OF SUB-CHAPTER EIGHT OF CHAPTER TWENTY-ONE OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN (1867), ENTITLED AN ACT TO REDUCE THE ACT INCORPORATING THE CITY OF ROCHESTER, IN THE COUNTY OF OLMTED, AND STATE OF MINNESOTA, AND THE SEVERAL ACTS AMENDATORY THEREOF, AND THE ACT TO ORGANIZE A BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR THE CITY OF ROCHESTER, AND THE SEVERAL ACTS AMENDATORY THEREOF, TO ONE ACT AND TO AMEND THE SAME.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section ten (10) of sub chapter eight (8) of chapter twenty-one (21) of the special laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven (1867), be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 10. The county treasurer of Olmsted county shall pay all orders signed by the president of the board of education of said city and attested by the clerk of said board, if there are sufficient funds in his hands belonging to said district, and shall deliver to the board of education the said orders so paid by him at the time of settlement with the said board, and the duties of the office of the district treasurer is hereby devolved upon the county treasurer of said county, and the office of district treasurer is hereby abolished, and the said county treasurer shall not receive any compensation for the services herein provided for.

SEC. 2. Section eleven (11) of said sub-chapter eight (8) is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 11. No money shall be drawn from the county treasury for on behalf of said school district, except on an order signed by the president of the board and attested by the clerk, stating in said order for what purpose the same is drawn; and the records of the district shall be so kept as to show the name of each member of the board of education voting for any appropriation; and no order shall be drawn on the county treasurer of said county of Olmsted on behalf of said district, except upon the affirmative vote of a majority of said board.

SEC. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent and in contravention of this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
