

Monthly pay
rolls and
expense lists.

SEC. 2. The accounting officers of each institution herein named, and of the several Normal Schools, shall make monthly duplicate pay rolls or expense lists, showing the name of each person rendering service or furnishing supplies, the nature of the service, and at what rate rendered, the quantity and kind of supplies furnished, and the amount to which each person is entitled by law. Said rolls or lists shall be verified by the oath of the principal officer of the Supervising Board of each institution, and the accounting officer of the same, and the said accounting officer shall, on or before the last day of each month, forward one of the said rolls or lists to the Auditor of State.

Auditor to
examine.

SEC. 3. On receipt of such certified expense lists, the Auditor of State shall examine, adjust and approve, or reject, the same, and on or before the tenth (10th) day of each month following draw his warrants for the amounts found due thereon to each institution. *Provided*, That five per cent. additional may be allowed each institution for contingent expenses, which shall be properly accounted for on the next monthly pay roll.

SEC. 4. All bills or accounts against the said State institutions shall be made out and receipted in duplicate, and on forwarding the pay rolls the last of each month, the said accounting officers shall also forward one set of such bills and vouchers for the preceding month, and having been compared by the Auditor of State with the proper pay rolls, they shall be filed with the same in his office and preserved subject to public inspection.

SEC. 5. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 118.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE MINNESOTA STATES PRISON.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the following amounts of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the following specified purposes out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated:

First—For the extension of a stone wall around the prison yard, the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.)

Extension of a stone wall.

Second—For the extension of the main building, to include rooms for deputy warden, guards, laundry and the enlargement of the hospital and chapel, ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.)

Extension of main building.

Third—For fire proof iron floor in the foundry, nine hundred and eighty-five dollars (\$985.)

Fire proof iron floor.

Fourth—For the extension of fire water pipes, five hundred and twenty dollars (\$520.)

Extension of fire water pipes.

Fifth—For extending the main sewer and planking the prison yard, sixteen hundred and fifty dollars (\$1650.)

Extending main sewer.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 119.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$15,000) FOR THE ERECTION OF WORK SHOPS, AND SECURING FIRE PROTECTION, AND FOR MACHINERY, AND FURNISHING SAID SHOPS AT THE STATE REFORM SCHOOL.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. That the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of the erection of work shops, and securing fire protection, and for machinery and furnishing the State Reform school.

SEC. 2. The sum of money so appropriated shall be paid on warrants drawn by the president of the board of managers and countersigned by the secretary thereof, and upon the presentation of such warrants, to the Auditor of State, he shall draw his warrants on the State Treasurer for the amount named in the warrants of said president and secretary, not exceeding in all the amount by this act appropriated, and the money drawn upon said warrants shall be expended under the direction of the Board of Managers of the State Reform School as provided by law. *Provided*, That five thousand dollars (\$5,000) of said sum shall be paid in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine (1879), and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty (1880).

How money to be paid.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
