

## CHAPTER 64.

AN ACT TO COMPLETE THE ORGANIZATION OF THE COUNTY OF POLK FOR JUDICIAL PURPOSES, AND ESTABLISH TERMS OF THE DISTRICT COURT THEREIN FOR THE COUNTIES OF POLK AND KITTSOON.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. The county of Polk is detached from the county of Clay, and declared to be organized for judicial purposes, with all the rights, privileges and immunities of counties of this State so organized, and the county of Kittson is detached from the county of Clay and attached to the county of Polk for judicial purposes.

SEC. 2. General terms of the District Court for the counties of Polk and Kittson, shall be held on the second (2nd) Tuesday in June and second (2nd) Tuesday in December in each year, at the city of Crookston, which is hereby established as the county seat of Polk county. *Provided*, That no grand jury shall be drawn or summoned for the December terms of said court until the year A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881) unless by the order of the Judge of said court duly made and entered in the minutes of said court at least thirty days before the commencement of such term.

SEC. 3. All civil suits now pending in the District Court of the county of Clay, properly triable in the county of Polk, shall be by stipulation of parties or by an order of the Judge of said court, made on application of either party, removed for trial to the county of Polk, and all judicial proceedings now pending in, and all recognizances and writs returnable to the District Court in the county of Clay, from the counties of Polk and Kittson, and all papers on file with the Clerk of the District Court in the county of Clay, which appertain to said counties of Polk and Kittson shall be forthwith transferred to the Clerk of said court for the county of Polk, and all records in the office of the Clerk of the District Court of Clay county, which appertain to said counties of Polk and Kittson shall be transcribed and recorded in the office of the Clerk of the District Court of Polk county.

SEC. 4. This act shall be a general act, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
