

CHAPTER CCCLIV.

AN ACT TO SELL AT THE NEXT ANNUAL TAX SALE IN THE COUNTY OF RAMSEY CERTAIN PROPERTY IN THE SIXTH WARD OF THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL, LATE A PART OF DAKOTA COUNTY, OMITTED FROM THE SPECIAL TAX SALE IN ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN, FOR TAXES OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOUR AND PRIOR YEARS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That all real estate situated in Brooklyn and Dunwell and Spencer's addition described in the tax duplicate and certificate of the board of supervisors of the town of West Saint Paul, heretofore sent by the auditor of Dakota county to the auditor of Ramsey county, and situated in the sixth ward of the city of St. Paul, late a part of Dakota county, and upon which the taxes for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four and prior years have not been paid, and which was omitted from the special sale September third, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, shall, by the proper officers of Ramsey county, be sold for the same at the annual tax sale in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine. For the purpose of more fully carrying out the object of this act, the auditor of Ramsey county is hereby fully authorized to correct any errors of description in said duplicate or certificate contained.

SEC. 2. The treasurer of Ramsey county shall pay all moneys received in payment of said taxes, or arising from said tax sale, to the treasurer of Dakota county as heretofore provided by law, and shall receive in payment of said tax and any unpaid taxes for one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four or prior years, any town or road, town hall or survey orders or other legal vouchers to the extent of the tax for such purposes and applicable to and for the payment of which such tax was levied or extended on said duplicate or certificate, and the treasurer of Dakota county shall receive the same in settlement of and to the extent of such tax only, as that to which they apply.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
