corporation, and said corporation shall in all respects be subject to the laws of this State, and in all suits or proceedings by or against said corporation, it shall be deemed for all purposes a domestic corporation. *Provided*, that no such corporation shall acquire or hold at any one time more than one hundred thousand (100,000) acres of land in this State, and that all lands acquired by it shall be sold within twenty-one (21) years after their acquisition, except such lands as may be acquired by it under mortgage foreclosure, or forfeiture of contracts for the salet hereof, which shall be disposed of by it within fifteen (15) years after such acquisition or forfeiture; and provided further, said corporation shall appoint an agent or attorney residing within this State, upon whom all process may be served, which appointment shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of State.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

CHAPTER 126.

AN ACT RELATING TO THE PAYMENT OF THE SALARIES OF COUNTY ATTORNEYS, JUDGES OF PROBATE AND COUNTY SUPERINTENDENTS OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The salaries of the County Attorneys, Judges of Probate and County Superintendents of Public Schools shall be paid monthly from the treasury of the county, upon the warrant of the County Auditor.

SEC. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the

provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
