CHAPTER 139.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and thirty (130), Special Laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-nine (1879), entitled "an act to establish the independent school district of Granite Falls.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That special act chapter one hundred and thirty (130) of the session laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-nine (1879) be amended by adding after section one the words "all delinquent taxes now collected or that may be hereafter collected in above described territory shall belong to said independent school district of Granite Falls, Yellow Medicine county, and be paid to the same by the county treasurer.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and

after its passage.

CHAPTER 140.

AN ACT to detach certain territory from independent school district No. one (1), in Nicollet county, and attach the same to school district No. twenty-seven (27).

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That all that part of independent school district number one (1), in Nicollet county, lying west of the city limits of the city of Saint Peter, and north of section twenty-nine (29), in town one hundred and ten (110) north of range twenty-six (26) west, be and the same is hereby detached from independent school district number one (1) of the county of Nicollet and State of Minnesota, and attach the same to school district number twenty-seven (27) of the same county.

SEC. 2. The scholars residing in the said detached territory shall be allowed to attend the public schools in said independent school district during the balance of the school year. or until July first (1st), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881).

SEC. 3. All taxes levied on said detached territory for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty (1880), and prior years, to be paid to, and collected by the said independent school district number one (1).

Sec. 4. This act to take effect and be in force from and after

its passage.
