

CHAPTER 154.

AN ACT to detach certain territory from school district fourteen (14), and attach the same to school district eighty-two (82), in township one hundred and five (105), range fourteen (14), in Olmsted county.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section six (6) and the northwest quarter, the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter, and the west half of the southwest quarter of section seven (7) in township one hundred and five (105), range thirteen (13), and the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section twelve (12) township one hundred and five (105), range fourteen, be and the same is hereby detached from school district fourteen (14) in the county of Olmsted and attached to school district number eighty-two (82) in said county of Olmsted.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 155.

AN ACT organizing school districts in the county of Cass.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That all that part of the county of Cass, in the State of Minnesota, except so much thereof as is included in any Indian reservation, east of a line commencing at the southeast corner of township one hundred and thirty-four (134), range thirty-three (33), for a point of commencement, thence running north on the county line to the northeast corner of town one hundred and thirty-eight (138), range thirty-three (33), thence east on township line to the southeast corner of township one hundred and thirty-nine (139), thence north on township lines to the north line of said Cass county, and the people now or hereafter inhabiting said territory be and the same hereby are organized and constituted a school district and body corporate, and shall be known as "school district number one (1) of Cass county," with all the rights, powers and privileges, except the power to levy taxes, appertaining to

or possessed by the common school districts of this State, organized under the General Laws of the State.

SEC. 2. That all that part of the county of Cass, in the State of Minnesota, except so much thereof as is included in any Indian reservation, west of the line mentioned in section two (2) of this act, and the people now or hereafter inhabiting said territory, be and hereby are organized and constituted a school district and a body corporate to be known as "school district number two (2) of Cass county," with all the rights, powers and privileges, except the power to levy taxes, appertaining to or possessed by the common school districts of the State, organized under the General Laws of the State.

SEC. 3. Each of said school districts shall be subject to all the laws of the State, regulating the common school districts of the State, so far as the same are applicable, except that the said districts shall not levy any taxes, *provided* that until the organization of Cass county, all papers, documents, and reports from the officers of said districts, and from teachers of the schools therein, required by law to be filed with or made to any county officer of the county in which such school districts are situated, shall be filed with and made to the proper county officer of the county to which said county of Cass is attached for record or judicial purposes, and all taxes levied and collected upon property in said school districts for school purposes shall be collected and paid, together with the moneys accruing to such districts from the State school fund, over to said school districts by the proper officers of the county to which said Cass county is attached for the purposes aforesaid.

SEC. 4. That an election may be called in each of said districts for the purpose of electing officers thereof, in the same manner as is now provided by law for the election of the first board of trustees, when new districts are formed by the board of county commissioners.

SEC. 5. Nothing in this act shall be construed as preventing the board of county commissioners of said Cass county, after its organization, from forming new school districts out of the territory hereinbefore set apart for said school districts.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
