

cute all such actions on the part of the village, when such village shall be the party or be interested in such actions, and no person shall be an incompetent juror by reason of being an inhabitant of said village in an action to which the village shall be a party. And whenever any judgment is rendered under the provisions of this act, for the imprisonment of any person, such judgment may be enforced by imprisonment in the village or county jail, or in the county jail of some other county, if there be no sufficient jail in McLeod county, as the court shall order in such judgment, and for such purpose the village shall have the use of such county jail, and the persons so committed shall be under the charge of the sheriff of such county, but at the expense of the village.

SEC. 37. In all respects not herein provided for, the portion of the territory of the village included in the town of Hutchinson shall be and remain a part of the town of Hutchinson.

SEC. 38. The corporation is invested with all powers to carry into full force, virtue and effect all and every part of the charter of said village and to carry into execution the same; shall have power to pass and ordain all and every ordinance necessary to carry out fully the meaning and intent thereof.

SEC. 39. This act shall be a public act and take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 23.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF LANSING IN COUNTY OF MOWER.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the southwest quarter of section three (3) the southeast quarter of section three (3), the northwest quarter of section eleven (11), the northeast quarter of section ten (10) and the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section three (3), all in township one hundred and three (103) north, of range eighteen (18) west in the county of Mower, is hereby set apart and incorporated as the Village of Lansing, under the provisions of chapter one hundred and thirty-nine (139) of the general laws of Minnesota for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-five (1875), and the amendments thereto, and shall be and is hereby constituted a separate election precinct for all purposes, provided the township and general elections may be held in said village of Lansing.

SEC. 2. That G. Wood, C. J. Ricker and J. W. George are hereby designated commissioners to carry out the provisions of section

nine (9) of said chapter, and the secretary of state is hereby directed to notify said commissioners of the passage of this act.

SEC. 3. That in addition to the officers to be elected under the provisions of Section two (2) of said chapter one hundred and thirty nine (139) the electors of said village of Lansing, shall at their first and annual elections thereafter elect one assessor, whose powers, duties and qualifications shall be the same as provided by general laws for township assessors.

SEC. 4. That in addition to the general powers conferred by the said chapter one hundred and thirty-nine (139), the village council shall have power;

First. To prescribe such additional duties for the officers of said village as they may by ordinance direct.

Second. To prevent the obstruction of public streets and public grounds.

Third. To provide for the compensation of the officers of said village.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 24.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF LAKE PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BECKER, UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER TEN (10), OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY EIGHTY (1878.)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That the following described territory in the county of Becker, to-wit: The west half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section two (2) and all of section three (3) in township one hundred and thirty-nine (139), range forty-three (43) be and the same is hereby set apart for incorporation as the village of Lake Park.

SEC. 2. That the following named persons are designated as commissioners under the general laws of this State, to post notices of the first election in said village, viz: O. I. Berg, A. H. Abraham, J. Froshaug or a majority of them.

SEC. 3. That upon organization as directed in the general laws of this State, the said territory shall constitute the village of Lake Park, and shall thereupon be endowed with all the rights, powers, franchises and duties therein prescribed, or to be hereafter prescribed for organized villages in this State.
