striking out the last paragraph of said section and inserting in lieu thereot the following provision: "Said commissioners shall be known and designated as the Lunacy Commission, and shall receive for their said services and expenses the sum of one hundred (100) dollars per annum each; for which the State Auditor shall draw his warrant on the State Treasurer, payable out of the General Fund.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 41.

AN ACT TO AMEND SUBDIVISION TWENTY-FIVE (25) OF SECTION TEN (10) OF CHAPTER SEVEN (7) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF A. D. ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878), APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR SAL-ARY OF THE REPORTER OF THE-SUPREME COURT AND OTHER PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That subdivision twenty-five (25) of section ten (10) of chapter seven (7) of the General Statutes of A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878), be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows: For salary of the Reporter of the Supreme Court, fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500), to take effect from and after December thirtyfirst (31st), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881,)

SEC 2. That the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated to pay for binding books, papers, and pamphlets of the State Library, to be drawn and expended under the direction and supervision of the Supreme Court.
