## CHAPTER 123.

AN ACT TO REGULATE THE SALARIES OF COUNTY TREASURERS AND AUDITORS WHEN UNORGANIZED COUNTIES ARE ATTACHED.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. It is hereby made the duty of the officers of each county in this state to which any unorganized or par- officers to keep tially unorganized county may be attached for judicial, separate rec record, taxation, or other purposes to keep separate and dis- counties. tinct books of accounts and records for each county so attached, which books of accounts and records shall be chargeable to and paid for by such attached county, and whenever such attached county shall become detached, said books of accounts and records shall be turned over to the proper officers of said county so detached as the property of such county, or to the officers of the county to which said detached county may thereafter become attached.

SEC. 2. The salaries of the treasurer and auditor of any How salaries of county in the state to which any unorganized or partially treasurer and organized county may be attached for taxation purposes computed. shall be regulated and computed upon the basis of the taxable valuation of their own county, and upon the basis of the valuation of each county thereto attached separately as provided by the general laws of this state regulating and fixing the salaries of county auditor and treasurer.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from when

## CHAPTER 124.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE MAKING OF OFFICIAL RE-PORTS.

Be it exacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That all state officers and the several charit- unical reports able, educational, penal and other institutions of this when to be state, from whom reports are required under existing laws,

for a period ending the thirtieth (30th) day of November, shall hereafter make reports for periods ending July thirty-first (31st), as hereinafter required, and the fiscal year of this state is by this act fixed to terminate in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (1883), and annually thereafter, on the thirty-first (31st) day of July in each year.

Reports must be printed and distributed by December first.

SEC. 2. The State Treasurer, the Secretary of State, the Railroad Commissioner and the State Board of Health, shall make a report for the period ending July thirty-first (31st), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (1883), and annually thereafter for the fiscal years as fixed by this All other state officers, and trustees and managers of said institutions, shall make reports for the period ending July thirty-first (31st), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four (1884), and biennially thereafter. The several state officers and the officers of the several state institutions, who under existing laws, are required to make reports to the Governor, shall hereafter make such reports on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of September of the year in which they are required to make reports, and all contracts for printing shall hereafter require such reports to be printed on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of November of the year in which such reports are made. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of State to supply the members of the legislature next to convene with a copy of each of the reports so printed on or before the first (1st) day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four (1884), and biennially thereafter. Provided, that the provisions of this act shall not apply to the Commissioner of Insurance and the Commissioner of Statistics. whose reports shall be made for the periods, and at the time fixed by existing laws.

SEC. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this

act are hereby repealed.

Sec 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
