

SEC. 4. That upon receipt of such report by the state auditor, he shall, upon demand of the county treasurer of said Nicollet county, draw his order or orders in favor of said county treasurer, on the state treasurer for the moneys belonging to said fund, to the amount of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00), and the state treasurer shall pay over such moneys to said county treasurer upon said orders, and such moneys shall be disbursed by said county treasurer upon the orders of said board of county commissioners towards paying off the cost of constructing said bridge. .

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 195.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEYS TO AID IN THE RECONSTRUCTION OF A WAGON BRIDGE OVER CROW RIVER ON LINE BETWEEN SECTION NINE (9) AND TEN (10), TOWNSHIP ONE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN (119), RANGE TWENTY-SEVEN (27), IN WRIGHT COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. That the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300) is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury belonging to the internal improvement fund, or out of the first moneys which shall come into the treasury belonging to said fund, not already appropriated, to aid the town of Middleville, in the county of Wright, in rebuilding the wagon bridge known as Boanis bridge over Crow river, on section line between sections nine (9) and ten (10), township one hundred and nineteen (119), range twenty-seven (27), town of Middleville; said bridge being on the mail route between the villages of Howard Lake and Clearwater.

SEC. 2. The moneys hereby appropriated shall be paid to the treasurer of said town of Middleville, upon the warrant of the state auditor, which warrant shall be issued upon the application of the board of supervisors of the said town of Middleville, with their certificates that said bridge is completed and open for travel.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
