CHAPTER 218.

AN ACT TO ANNEX CERTAIN TERRITORY TO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-EIGHT (158), (AT LANESBORO), IN FILLMORE COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the northwest quarter, of the northeast quarter, of section eighteen (18), in township one hundred and three (103), north of range nine (9) west, be, and the same is hereby detached from common school district number forty-nine (49), in Fillmore county, and attached to and made a part of independent school district number one hundred and fifty-eight (158), (at Lanesboro), of said county, changing thereby the boundaries of said independent school district as fixed by chapter one hundred and fifty-seven (157), of the special laws of Minnesota, for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881), entitled "an act for the establishment and regulation of the public schools in the village of Lanesboro."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

passage.

CHAPTER 219.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY OF THE INTERNAL IMPROVEMENT FUND TO BUILD A BRIDGE ACROSS DES MOINES RIVER AND LIME CREEK, IN MURRAY COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That, the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury belonging to the internal improvement fund, or out of the first (1 t) money that shall come into the treasury belonging to said fund, to build a bridge across the Des Moines river, on the north line of section two (2), town one hundred and five (105), range thirty-nine, Murray county, and the exact locality of said bridge shall be where the north line of said section two (2) shall cross the said Des Moines river near northwest corner of said section, and the further sum of three hundred dollars (\$300), be and the same is hereby appropriated out of same fund, or out of the first (1st) money that shall come into the
