

CHAPTER 276.

AN ACT TO PREVENT CATTLE, HORSES, SHEEP AND SWINE FROM RUNNING AT LARGE IN THE TOWN OF LAKELAND, WASHINGTON COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That from and after the passage of this act it shall be unlawful, in the town of Lakeland, Washington county, Minnesota, for any cattle, horses, sheep or swine to run at large upon the public commons or public streets or highways of the said town of Lakeland, and any cattle, horses, sheep or swine so found running at large upon any of said commons, streets or public highways may be distrained and impounded in like manner as other beasts found doing damage are distrained under the laws of the state of Minnesota.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 277.

AN ACT TO PREVENT THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF CATTLE, HORSES OR OTHER DOMESTIC ANIMALS IN THAT PORTION OF THE TOWN OF KINGSTON LYING SOUTH OF THE CROW RIVER IN THE COUNTY OF MEEKER AND STATE OF MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to allow cattle, horses, sheep or swine, or other domestic animals owned by such person or persons, or of which such person or persons have control or may be in possession, to run at large upon any highway, or upon the lands of any other person or persons in that portion of the town of Kingston lying south of the Crow river, in the county of Meeker, state of Minnesota, during any season of the year, unless they are properly herded.

SEC. 2. Any person or persons who shall violate or neglect the provisions of the first section of this act, shall be liable for all damages that may be caused in consequence of the trespass of such animal or animals.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.
