

days services in any one (1) year, including all services rendered in general and special sessions, upon committees, or for any other object or purpose, and the auditor of said county is hereby prohibited from issuing orders to any of said commissioners for more than forty-five (45) days services in any one (1) year, except as provided in section four (4) of said act.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 72.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER SIXTY-THREE (63), OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE (1873), ENTITLED AN ACT TO PREVENT THE DRAINING OF CLEAR LAKE, SITUATED IN THE TOWN OF WOODVILLE, IN WASECA COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That chapter sixty-three (63), of the special laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three (1873), be amended by adding the following two (2) sections after section one (1) of said chapter and before section two (2) of said chapter as the same now is, viz:

Section 2. Any person or persons violating the preceding section, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10), nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100).

Section 3. Justices of the peace shall have cognizance and jurisdiction of all offences under this act, and jurisdiction concurrent with other justices of the peace in and for said county, is hereby given of offences under this act to the justice of the peace of the city of Waseca.

All prosecutions under this act shall be deemed criminal proceedings, and shall be prosecuted and determined as provided by law for the prosecution of offences cognizable before justice of the peace.

SEC. 2. That section two (2) of said chapter be, and hereby is changed to section four (4), of said chapter sixty-three (63), of the special laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three (1873).

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
