CHAPTER 244.

AN ACT TO REIMBURSE L. H. McKUSICK FOR EXPENSES
INCURRED IN A CONTESTED ELECTION.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of one thousand (1,000) dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated to L. H. McKusick out of any moneys, in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, to reimburse him for moneys expended in the contested election case of William H. Wynkoop against L. H. McKusick, for a seat in the house of representatives, for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty five (1885).

CHAPTER 245.

AN ACT TO REIMBURSE THE COUNTY OF BIG STONE FOR
EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE TRIAL AND PUNISHMENT
OF A NON-RESIDENT MURDERER.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of one thousand (1,000) dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money

in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to reimburse the county of Big Stone for expenses incurred in the arrest and prosecution of John Noonan, a non-resident of said county, who was convicted of murder in the second degree at the June term of the district court for said Big Stone county, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (1883); and that the auditor of state draw a warrant on the state treasurer in favor of said county for said amount.

CHAPTER 246.

AN ACT TO REIMBURSE THE CITY OF MANKATO FOR MONEY EXPENDED IN MAKING AN EXHIBIT AT THE NEW ORLEANS EXPOSITION.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of one thousand (1,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, to reimburse the city of Mankato for money expended in preparing, presenting and caring for its exhibits of products and industries at the New Orleans world's exposition between December first (1st), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four (1884), and May thirty-first (31st), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five (1885); *Provided*, That the stone monument contained in said exhibit may remain the property of the state for a permanent exhibit at New Orleans or elsewhere as the governor of the state may arrange for.
