AN ACT TO AMEND SUBDIVISION NINE (9) OF SECTION SIXTEEN (16) OF CHAPTER TEN (10) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878), RELATING TO POWERS OF ELECTORS AT TOWN MEETINGS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That subdivision nine (9) of section sixteen (16) of chapter ten (10) of the general statutes of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878) be amended

so as to read as follows:

"To vote to raise such sums of money for the repairs and construction of roads and bridges as they deem necessary, and to determine the amount thereof to be assessed by the supervisors as labor tax, and the amount thereof to be assessed and collected as other town taxes, also to vote such sums of money for the support of the poor and for other necessary town charges as they deem expedient. Provided, That they may, at their annual town meeting direct such an amount of the poll and road tax of the town to be expended on the highways in an adjoining town, as they deem conducive to the interests of the town, which labor and tax shall be expended under the direction of the supervisors of the town furnishing the same; provided, further, that where more than one entire congressional township is included within an organized town, the poll and road tax raised within the limits of each of such congressional townships shall be expended within such congressional township, unless raised to be expended outside of such organized town in an adjoining town.

SEC. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this

act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
