

CHAPTER 230.

[H. F. No. 92.]

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THE MINNESOTA REPORTS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby authorized and empowered to contract with the West Publishing Company for the continuance of the publication of the Minnesota Reports for eight (8) years from the termination of the contract now existing between the state and the said company.

Minnesota reports.

SEC. 2. The reports so published to be of the same quality and description as required by the terms of the present contract, and to be sold to this state and all citizens of this state at two (2) dollars per copy. The copyright of all volumes published under such contract to be taken out in the name of the secretary of state for the benefit of the state.

Price.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 231.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE LEVY OF TAXES FOR STATE PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JULY THIRTY-FIRST (31ST), ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT (1888), AND JULY THIRTY-FIRST (31ST), ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE (1889.)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state for the fiscal year ending July thirty-first (31st) one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight (1888), a tax of eight hundred thousand (800,000) dollars, or as near that amount as practicable, shall be levied on all taxable property in the state.

State tax levy 1888.

Provided, That the tax hereby levied shall not exceed a

rate of one mill and seven-tenths of a mill (\$.0017) on each dollar of taxable property.

State tax levy
1889.

SEC. 2. For the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state for the fiscal year ending July thirty-first (31st), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (1889), a tax of eight hundred and twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars, or as near that amount as practicable, shall be levied on all the taxable property in the state. *Provided*, That the tax hereby levied shall not exceed a rate of one mill and seven-tenths of a mill (\$.0017) on each dollar of taxable property.

SEC. 3. All taxes levied under the provisions of this act, when collected and paid into the state treasury, shall be placed to the credit of the general revenue fund.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 232.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Mississippi

SECTION 1. That the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, to be disbursed by the governor of the state in the payment of the necessary expenses incurred by the commissioners in attending to the duties of their office, as provided by chapter ninety-three (93) of general laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881), special session.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
