

druggists when duly licensed by the city council, the same not to be used or drunk upon the premises where sold; and any person who shall vend, deal in or dispose of spirituous, vinous, fermented or malt liquors within the present or future limits of said city of Minneapolis, except when licensed by the city council of the city of Minneapolis, and within the limits herein designated, shall be subject to all the pains and penalties provided by chapter sixteen (16) of the general statutes, of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878) for selling spirituous, vinous, fermented or malt liquors without a license, as well as to any punishment provided by any ordinance passed by the city council of the city of Minneapolis as in this chapter provided.

SEC. 4. All acts and parts of acts relating to the charter of the city of Minneapolis which may conflict with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 14.

### AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF MINNEAPOLIS.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.*

SECTION 1. That the act entitled "An act to amend and consolidate the charter of the city of Minneapolis", approved March eighth (8th), A. D. eighteen hundred and eighty one (1881), the same being chapter seventy-six (76) of the special laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881), as amended by an act entitled "an act to amend the charter of the city of Minneapolis", approved February twenty-seventh (27th), A. D., eighteen hundred and eighty-three (1883), the same being chapter three (3) of the special laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (1883), and as amended by an act entitled "an act to amend the charter of the city of Minneapolis", approved March fifth (5th), A. D. eighteen hundred and eighty-five (1885), the same being chapter two (2) of the special laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five (1885), be and the same hereby is further amended by striking out, adding to and altering the same in the manner following, to-wit:

SEC. 2. By so altering section twenty-seven (27) of chapter three (3) thereof, that it shall read as follows: Section twenty-seven (27). The mayor shall receive an annual salary of two thousand (2000) dollars. Each alderman shall receive an annual salary of seven hundred and twenty (720) dollars, and, in addition thereto, members of the board of equalization of taxes, and aldermen acting as judges of election may be given compensation for such special services.

SEC. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
