

CHAPTER 286.

[H. F. No. 822.]

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF BLUE EARTH, TO PAY THE COMMISSIONER OF THE SECOND (2ND) COMMISSIONER DISTRICT OF SAID COUNTY EXTRA COMPENSATION FOR CARE IN LOOKING AFTER THE POOR.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for the county commissioners of the county of Blue Earth at their first annual session in each year, or at any subsequent session thereafter of said board, by motion or resolution to appoint the commissioner of the second (2nd) commissioner district, to act for said board in relation to the care of the poor, of the said second (2nd) district including the city of Mankato, at a compensation of not more than three (3) dollars per day for each day actually and necessarily employed in such capacity, in addition to all compensation received by said commissioner; but said commissioner so appointed shall receive pay for such services for not more than eighty (80) days in any one year.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 287.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAC QUI PARLE COUNTY, TO MAKE TEMPORARY ARRANGEMENTS FOR A PLACE TO HOLD THE TERMS OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF SAID COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. The board of county commissioners of Lac Qui Parle county, is hereby authorized and empowered to lease or rent a suitable hall in which to hold the several sessions of the terms of the district court in said county, whenever they deem it most convenient in said county, the place so selected shall be the place where all sessions of the district court of said county shall be held until otherwise ordered by the said board of county commissioners, or until a suitable court house shall have been built in said county.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
