CHAPTER 288.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF POPE COUNTY TO OFFER BOUNTIES FOR THE KILLING OF BLACKBIRDS AND GOPHERS, DIFFERENT IN AMOUNT AND VALUE FROM THOSE NOW PRESCRIBED BY LAW.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. The county commissioners of the county of Pope, in this state are hereby authorized and empowered to offer bounties for the killing of blackbirds, and gophers of all kinds, except pocket gophers, under the provisions of chapter one hundred forty-four (144) general laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven (1887), less in amount and value than the bounties prescribed by said chapter, and any person who hereafter kills or destroys gophers or blackbirds in said Pope county shall be entitled to receive therefor no more bounty than may be offered by said county commissioners under the provisions of this act.

SEC. 2. The county commissioners of said Pope county are hereby authorized and empowered to offer such bounties for the killing of pocket gophers and blackbirds, greater in amount and value than the bounties provided for by said chapter one hundred forty four (144), general laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven (1887),

as they may deem necessary and expedient.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 289.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WINONA COUNTY TO DESIGNATE A GERMAN NEWSPAPER IN WHICH THE OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MAY BE PUBLISHED IN THE GERMAN LANGUAGE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The county commissioners of the county of Winona are hereby authorized, in addition to the official newspaper which they are now by law required to designate, in their discretion, to further designate some newspaper, in said county, printed in the German language, in which they may direct their official proceedings or any portion thereof to be printed in such language.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

passage.
