AN ACT TO REPEAL AN ACT AUTHOBIZING AND REQUIRING EACH TOWN IN KANDIYOHI COUNTY TO SUPPORT ITS OWN POOR

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That chapter two hundred and seventy (270) of the special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-three (1883), entitled, "An act authorizing and requiring each town in Kandiyohi county to support its own poor," and all amendments thereto, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. The proposition to have said act and amendments thereto repealed, shall be submitted to a vote of the electors of said Kandiyohi county at the next annual town meeting after the passage of this act. The ballots to be used shall have written or printed, or partly written and partly printed upon them the following: "For repeal of the act authorizing and requiring each town in Kandiyohi county to support its own poor;" or "Against repeal of the act authorizing and requiring each town in Kandiyohi county to support its own poor." Said votes shall be cast at said town meeting in the same manner as votes cast for town officers, and said votes shall be canvassed in the same manner as votes cast for county officers; and if upon such canvass a majority of the votes cast shall be in favor of the repeal of said act, it shall be repealed; otherwise not.

SEC. 3. It is hereby made the duty of the county auditor of said Kandiyohi county, at least fifteen (15) days prior to said annual town meeting, to notify the town clerks of the several towns in said county, to insert a paragraph in the notice of the annual town meeting, setting forth that the question of repealing said law will be voted upon at said town meeting; and it is hereby made the duty of the town clerks of the several towns of said county, to insert such paragraph in said notice of annual town meeting; *provided*, however, that any neglect or failure on the part of said auditor, or any of said town clerks to give such notice, shall not invalidate the vote or prohibit the canvass of the votes cast upon such proposition.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
