SEC. 2. The treasurer of the state shall pay the same to Mrs. A. C. Lull or order, upon the approval of this act.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval.

CHAPTER 173.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR MRS. AUGUSTA HJORTSBERG.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Mrs. A. Hjortsberg, for salary of deceased husband.

SECTION 1. That the sum of eight hundred (800) dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of paying to Augusta Hjortsberg, widow of the late Victor Hjortsberg, being the amount of salary, at the rate of one hundred dollars (\$100) per month, for services as chief clerk in the office of the secretary of state for the unexpired portion of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (1889).

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
