

Petitioners must reside within six miles of proposed change.

than one hundred (100) legal voters, residing within six (6) miles of any proposed location, establishment, change or vacation of a highway, petition the board of county commissioners of such county for the location, establishment, change or vacation of any highway running into more than one town of said county, and not within the limits of any incorporated city, whether such highway is connected or to be connected with other roads or not, setting forth in such petition the beginning, course and termination of the highway proposed to be located, established, changed or vacated, together with the names of the owners of the land, if known, through which the same may pass, the auditor of such county shall lay such petition before the board of county commissioners at their next session thereafter."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 68.

Amending Chap. 13, Sec. 34, Statutes of 1878.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION THIRTY-FOUR (34) OF CHAPTER THIRTEEN (13) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878).

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Requiring petitions for discontinuance of roads, etc., to be filed with town clerk and posted.

SECTION 1. That section thirty-four (34) of Chapter thirteen (13) of the General Statutes one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878) be amended so as to read as follows: "When any number of legal voters as aforesaid determine to petition the supervisors for the alteration or discontinuance of any road, or laying out any new road, they shall file their petition with the town clerk and cause a copy of their petition to be posted up in three (3) of the most public places of the town twenty (20) days before any action is had in relation thereto."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
