CHAPTER 492.

AN ACT REGULATING THE TAKING OF FISH IN THE WATERS OF HEN-NEPIN COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful to catch, kill or destroy, in any manner otherwise than with hook and line, any fish in any lake,

river or stream in the county of Hennepin.

SEC. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction thereof, before any justice of the peace in said county or before a judge of the municipal court of the city of Minneapolis, be punished by fine of not less than twenty (20) nor more than fifty (50) dollars for each and every fish so caught, captured, taken or destroyed, together with the costs of prosecution.

One half of all fines collected for violation of this act shall be

paid to the person making the complaint.

SEC. 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act are

hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 493.

[H. F. No. 358.]

AN ACT TO REGULATE THE CATCHING OF BROOK TROUT IN THE WATERS OF THE STREAM KNOWN AS THOMPSON'S CREEK, AND ITS TRIBUTARIES (EXCLUSIVE OF LAKE COMO), IN THE COUNTY OF HOUSTON.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. No person shall, for the period of four (4) years from and after the passage of this act, catch, kill or take, by any device whatever, any speckled river or brook trout in the stream known as Thompson's creek and its tributaries (exclusive of Lake Como), in the county of Houston, in the state of Minnesota.

SEC. 2. After the expiration of the four (4) years specified in section one (1) of this act, no speckled river or brook trout shall be taken from said stream and its tributaries (exclusive of Lake Como), except between the first (1st) day of May and the fifteenth (15th) day of September in each year; and during such periods by means of hook

and line only.
