CHAPTER 99.

Capitol engineer.

An act to amend the first subdivision of section one of chapter one hundred of the general laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the same being an act to specify the officers who are to be employed in the care and comfort of the capitol building, defining their duties and fixing their salaries.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

Amending general laws of 1879, chap. 100.

Increases salary.

SECTION 1. That subdivision one of section one of chapter one hundred of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, approved March 8, 1879, be and the same is hereby amended by striking out the words "twelve hundred (1200)" where the same appear in the last two lines of said subdivision, and inserting in place thereof the words and figures "fifteen hundred (1500)."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 100.

Public libraries.

An act to amend section one of chapter one hundred and six of the general laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, relating to the establishment and maintenance of free public libraries and reading rooms.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

Amending general laws of 1879, chap. 106.

Villages may vote to establish.

SECTION 1. That section one of chapter one hundred and six of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine be amended by adding thereto the following words, viz.: Upon petition of fifty freeholding citizens in any such city or village the council of any such city or village shall submit the question of the establishment of such public library or reading-room to the legal voters of such city or village at the next annual election held therein, and if a two-thirds majority of the votes cast at such election are in favor of the establishment of such public library or reading-room, then the council of such city or village shall establish the same and shall annually thereafter levy for the maintenance of such public library or reading-room the tax recommended by the said petitioners, not to exceed, however, the rate hereinbefore provided.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
